Dear Ms. Morrison:

Attorney General Dana Nessel has asked me to respond to your recent email regarding your website and alleged financial crimes.

Thank you for the comments and views expressed in your e-mail. The Attorney General appreciates hearing from citizens on matters of public concern and while the Attorney General may not necessarily agree with some of the points made in your e-mail, we wish to thank you for taking the time to share your concerns with our office.

Many of the concerns you express are the result of state legislation. The Attorney General cannot change these laws. Rather, the Attorney General is dutybound to enforce the laws that have been enacted by the Legislature. Therefore, I suggest you contact your state representative or senator with your concerns regarding family courts. He or she may be of greater assistance in addressing and resolving your concerns.

Furthermore, if you have information that you believe may indicate specific criminal conduct on the part of any individuals referred to in your e-mail, please provide that information and any relevant evidence to the prosecuting attorney of the county where the alleged criminal conduct occurred. It is only in exceptional cases, such as where a statute expressly confers jurisdiction on the Attorney General, or a prosecuting attorney is disqualified, that the Attorney General undertakes the role of a prosecuting officer.

In addition, this office has no authority to modify or challenge court orders, nor do we have jurisdiction over the Friend of the Court. Rather, the role of the Attorney General is limited to criminal violations of the Felony Non-Support Statute.

This office is responsible for providing legal advice to various state departments and officials. In the absence of express statutory authority, however, the law does not permit this office to act as an attorney for private individuals. Therefore, this office is not able to provide advice regarding this matter. For legal advice regarding your concerns, you may wish to consult your own attorney who can advise you of your interests and the options that may be available to you.
