PER CURIAM.

Defendant appeals by right a property division order following a default judgment of divorce. Intervening appellant, Rose Buglione, a third party claiming interests in property that is the subject matter of that judgment, also appeals the property division order. We reverse.

Plaintiff and defendant were married in 1979. No children were born of the marriage. Plaintiff left defendant and moved out of state in 1987. Plaintiff filed for divorce in 1987 but the complaint was dismissed for lack of progress in 1988. She filed a second complaint for divorce in 1990. Defendant was served with this complaint but did not respond. The trial court issued a default judgment on October 29, 1990.

The property division portion of the default judgment of divorce stated that plaintiff would receive fifty percent of each the following: the marital home, a Sanilac County property and a B-25 bomber. Defendant was a renovator of old airplanes. The parties stipulated that the three properties at issue were all owned by defendant prior to the marriage. He did not transfer any interest in them to plaintiff during the marriage.
