Dear Judge Maceroni:

On May 11, 1999 I had a show cause in front of you regarding the nonpayment of support on this file. You ordered the transcript of the March 16, 1999 hearing when the woman appeared with counsel. It resulted in the attached order that was entered April 27, 1999.

You indicated, on the record, on May 11, 1999 that if the woman was wrong regarding her objections, she would be going to jail. You also indicated that as to my show cause, it would go a long way if the woman started to pay on the account, you have decided twice that her claim of disability is false or fraudulent because we were receiving Income Withholding payments during the same time that she claimed disability. Also the doctor's statements that she provided were not adequate.

I wanted to set up a show cause hearing and hearing regarding her objections as soon as possible after the transcript was completed. This hearing will be scheduled for July. I have taken the liberty of reviewing the transcript and comparing it to the order. I can only find two items that are different and I do not feel they are substantial. First, Ms. Morrison had thirty days from May 16, 1999 to obtain medical insurance coverage, the order indicates she must have that insurance coverage by May 1, 1999 which is to her advantage since it is approximately fifteen days longer than what was placed on the record. Secondly, Mr. Hannaford was required to use the physicians in the insurance plan or network that Ms. Morrison obtained insurance from and it appeared from the transcript that should have been a paragraph in the order. Other than that, I can find no differences and would be interested in your comments.

It should be noted that since May 11, 1999, when you ordered Ms. Morrison to pay towards the balance, we have charged the account \$275.00 per week which amounts to \$1,650.00. Ms. Morrison has paid exactly \$448.00 since May 11, 1999.
